Don Barnes asked if any members had shop ideas to share. Bill showed that he had made "steering wheels" to make it easier to adjust his Longworth chuck. Lin mentioned using pipe insulation to protect your fingers when sanding.

Bob said a friend of his is selling a 14" Yates American lathe, model 170, variable speed for \$950. It is 36" long with a 1 1/8" spindle. Terry has a Jet mini lathe for sale.

Lin graciously agreed to host the July pot luck again this year. The date is to be determined.

Jeanette announced that the items the club sold to the High Country Conference Center that were made from NAU wood will be on display at the Conference Center for the June 7th First Friday Art Walk. Bob indicated that he also will have something in the display. As requested, she will send out a reminder.

Lin commented that it would be good if we could get photos of items in various displays/exhibits and include them in the newsletter.

The club was reminded about the upcoming display at the branch library in July? and participation in the county fair. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to participate in the county fair Saturday and Sunday (Aug. 31-Sept. 1) with the understanding that all members will participate, especially with set-up and teardown. We will demonstrate from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. both days. Rebecca will contact the coordinator at the fair.

Lin asked for help from anyone who might have seen the Delta face plate she thinks she brought to the last meeting.


